

# The Neighborhood Crawl!

You've heard of a pub crawl or an art crawl... this is the neighborhood crawl! Just follow this map to 8 different stops that help us "move back into the neighborhood" this summer. Will you join in and step intentionally towards what God is doing in your neighborhood this summer?

### 1 - Moving back into the Neighborhood - Meet one new neighbor and get their name.

Ideas: Knock on the door, say hi over the fence, greet them at the park, chat while waiting at the copier, stop by the business suite next to yours.

#### 2 - Listen to Your Neighbors - Ask about your Neighbor's Story

Ideas: Ask about something that seems important to them, bring up something you have in common, ask the story of how they came to live/work here.

#### 3 - Listen to Your Neighborhood - Prayer walk around your neighborhood

Ideas: go on your own, with the dog, kids or with someone else and be very aware of what you see around you. As you notice different things, pray for what comes to mind. Pray that God's Kingdom would come in your neighborhood.

#### 4 - Receive From Your Neighbors - Receive advice or help from a neighbor

Ideas: ask for advice, help or to borrow and item you may need. It may feel risky to do so, but when we receive from our neighbors we build reciprocal relationships.

### 5 - Rest with Your Neighbors - Rest where you know you will see neighbors

Ideas: Put chairs in your front yard, or take your break with a co worker you'd like to get to know. Spend time at the park and see if there are others to get to know.

## 6 - Eat with Your Neighbors - Eat a meal with a neighbor

Ideas: We eat 21 meals in a week, spend one with a co-worker or neighbor. Invite them to go to lunch, have people over for a BBQ, head to the park for a picnic.

# 7 - Celebrate with Your Neighbors - Celebrate with others

Ideas: Join in a celebration or host a celebration that people are already planning on participating in. For instance, National Night Out, Neighborhood events, Events happening near your workplace.

8 - Tell the story of God in your Neighborhood - Share with a neighbor who seems open, one way you saw God move this summer. Ideas: If there is one person who you have been able to connect with talk to them about how you have experienced God in your neighborhood over the years, or even over the neighborhood crawl.
